Major Criteria	<ul> <li>Two positive blood cultures with suspicious organism</li> <li>Vegetation seen on ECG</li> </ul>
Minor Criteria	<ul> <li>Fever</li> <li>History of intravenous drug use or predisposing heart condition</li> <li>Immunologic phenomena (eg, Osler nodes, Roth spots, glomerulonephritis)</li> <li>Positive culture that does not meet major criteria</li> <li>Vascular phenomena (eg, Janeway lesions, stroke, pulmonary embolus)</li> </ul>
