Modified Duke Criteria*	
Major Criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two positive blood cultures with suspicious organism • Vegetation seen on ECG
Minor Criteria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fever • History of intravenous drug use or predisposing heart condition • Immunologic phenomena (eg, Osler nodes, Roth spots, glomerulonephritis) • Positive culture that does not meet major criteria • Vascular phenomena (eg, Janeway lesions, stroke, pulmonary embolus)

**Diagnosis is made with two major criteria, one major criterion and three minor criteria, or all five minor criteria*
