Hypothyroidism (TSH2) Depression, fatigue, or weight gain Rapid-cycling bipolar disorder Hypo- or hyperthyroidism (TSH²) Episode of depression that emerged while on lithium prophylaxis Hypothyroidism (TSH²) Restless or non-refreshing sleep, daytime sleepiness or fatigue, or depression Sleep apnea (polysomnography) Restless leg syndrome Iron deficiency (serum ferritin) Manic symptoms without a prior or family history of bipolar disorder Abuse of amphetamines (urine drug screen) Suspected alcohol abuse Occult abuse of alcohol (GGT³)
