Duration	1 year
Size	Medium (n = 119)
Patients	Bipolar I (63%) or bipolar II (37%) depression
Dose	10-60 mg/day (mean 27 mg)
Outcomes	Rating scales for depression and mania at 6 weeks (primary outcome) and 1 year (secondary outcome): Montgomery-Åsberg Depression Rating Scale (MADRS) and Mania Rating Scale of the Schedule for Affective Disorders and Schizophrenia (MRS-SAD)
Result	No difference in mania or depression after 6 weeks or 1 year, except those with prior rapid cycling who had more manic symptoms on citalopram
