Medications for Stimulant Use Disorders		
Medication	Dosing	Special Considerations
Bupropion XL	450 mg PO qAM	<ul> <li>Good for comorbid ADHD, depression, nicotine use disorder</li> <li>Risk of seizures</li> <li>Risk of abuse</li> <li>Combine with naltrexone (XR IM q3wks)</li> </ul>
Disulfiram	250–500 mg PO daily	<ul> <li>Good for comorbid AUD</li> <li>Risk of hepatotoxicity</li> <li>Beware inadvertent reaction with alcohol, especially at high doses</li> </ul>
Mirtazapine	30 mg PO daily	Good for comorbid depression, insomnia, underweight
Modafinil	400 mg PO qAM	Good for comorbid ADHD     Risk of abuse
Naltrexone	380 mg IM q3wks	<ul><li>Good for comorbid AUD</li><li>Caution in patients with liver disease</li><li>Combine with bupropion</li></ul>
Topiramate	200–300 mg PO daily	Good for comorbid AUD and weight loss     Cognitive clouding side effect     Risk of kidney stones, metabolic derangements
